

Instruction: Instructional Leadership Team (ILT)

Reading every day is one of the best ways to improve reading skills. Reading builds a child's vocabulary, develops imagination, promotes logical thinking, allows children to explore new places and different situations, and increases awareness and comprehension. Establish a regular reading time at the beginning of the school year, and it will become routine in no time! To develop reading routines and make reading a regular part of your family's schedule you can:

- Let your child see you as a reader
- Create a cozy, comfortable spot for reading at home. Be sure there is good lighting in this area.
- Establish a time for reading. After dinner or right before bedtime are great options.
- Share and talk about what everyone in the family is reading.
- Take a field trip to a bookstore or local library.
- Buy books as gifts

Make Reading FUN – not a chore or punishment!

During the month of September, students in grades 1-5 will take iReady diagnostic assessments in both reading and math. The data from these online tests will provide valuable information that will be used to drive instruction for the first quarter. Please encourage your child to do their best during testing and, if possible, please send wired headphones/earbuds (labeled with your child's name) to school to use when completing the iReady assessments. Home reports with the results of each test will be sent home after testing is complete.

Instructional Specialist – Math: Mrs. Clements

In the first week of school, we are working on building a math community. It is important that our students learn how to use math tools, communicate ideas, listen to each other, and most importantly learn from their mistakes.

You are probably wondering how you can help your child at home. All students at Berry Elementary have access to an online math program called Dreambox. This computer program matches the standards we are teaching in school. Each child will follow their own adaptive pathway and have an individualized learning experience. Important reminders for using the program at home:

- \cdot Make sure students are working INDEPENDENTLY so students are working at their level.
- · Students should complete five lessons weekly and spend approximately 60 minutes total a week (preferably not all in one sitting).
- \cdot Students should log in through their Office 365 account and access Dreambox through Clever.

Safety for all students and staff is the number one priority. You child may have shared that they are practicing a variety of drill since the start of school. So that all families feel informed about our safety protocol as well as the language and safepractices that we participate in regularly, I am including some quick links and resources for your convenience.
